Clara Barton (1821 - 1912) Clara Barton was an American nurse who is credited with founding the American Red Cross. She was an nurse during the Civil War where she provided treatment to many of the wounded men.

Susan La Flesche Picotte, MD (1865 – 1915)

Susan Picotte became the first Indigenous woman to receive a medical degree and she went on to open the first hospital on a reservation that was not funded by the government.



COLORECTAL CANCER

WHAT IS IT?

Colorectal cancer is a serious disease in which the cells of the colon or rectum grow uncontrollably. It is also known as colon cancer. The earlier the screening for this disease, the higher the chances of catching it in its early stages become which is why screening for this disease is extremely important to one's health. Some symptoms include bowl changes, abdominal pains, or a bloody stool

STAGES

Stage 0: Cancer cells found on innermost lining and have not spread.

Stage I: Tumour has spread beyond inner layer, but not past colon

Stage II: Cancer grown outside colon, but not to lymph nodes

Stage III: Cancer has grown outside colon AND lymph nodes

Stage IV: Cancer has spread to other parts of the body

TREATMENTS

- Surgery (Polyp) removal, Laparoscopic Surgery, Partial Colectomy, etc)
- Chemotherapy
- Radiation Therapy
- Palliative Care
