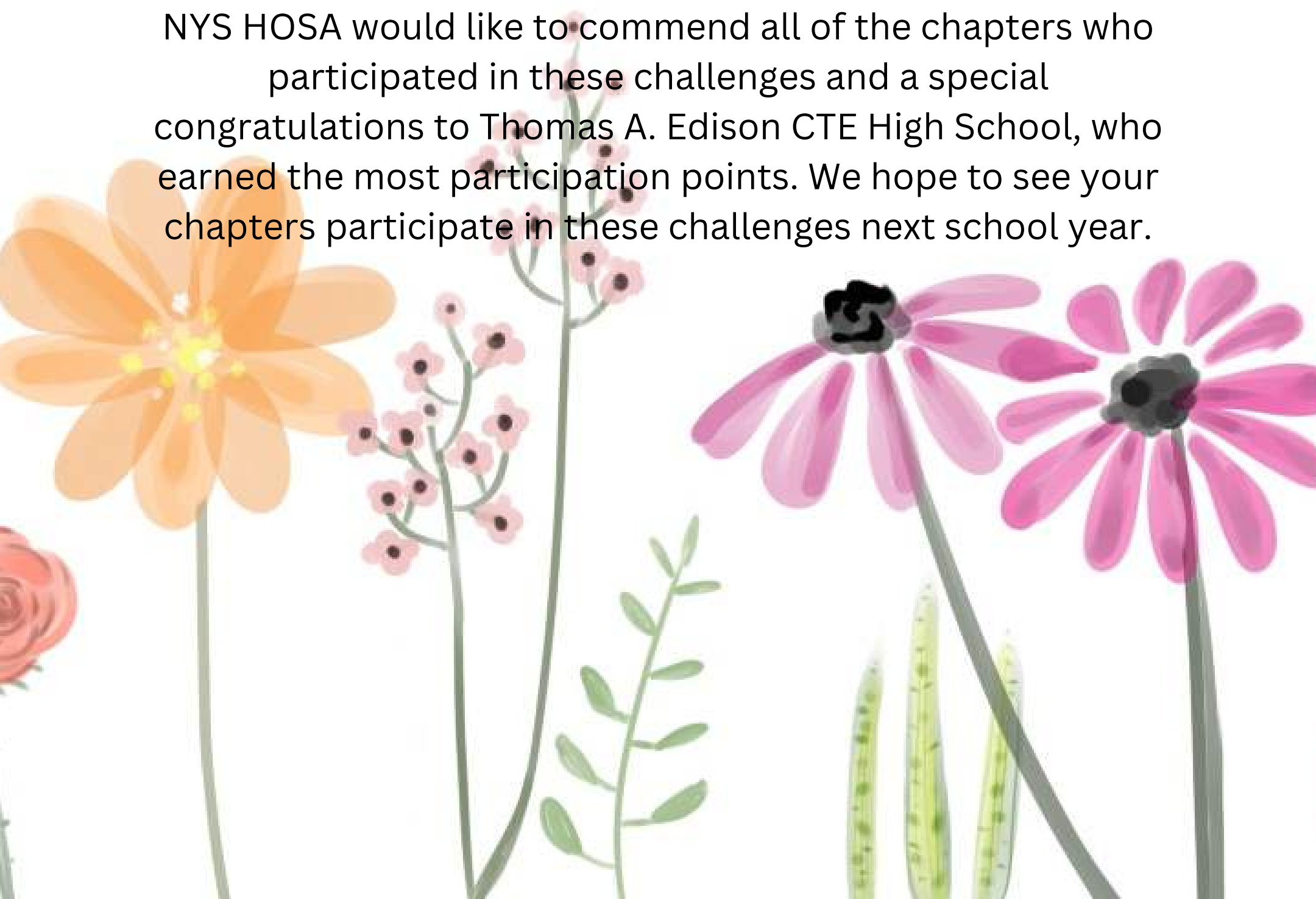

HOSA leaders changed the game with innovations in education and in the health industry.

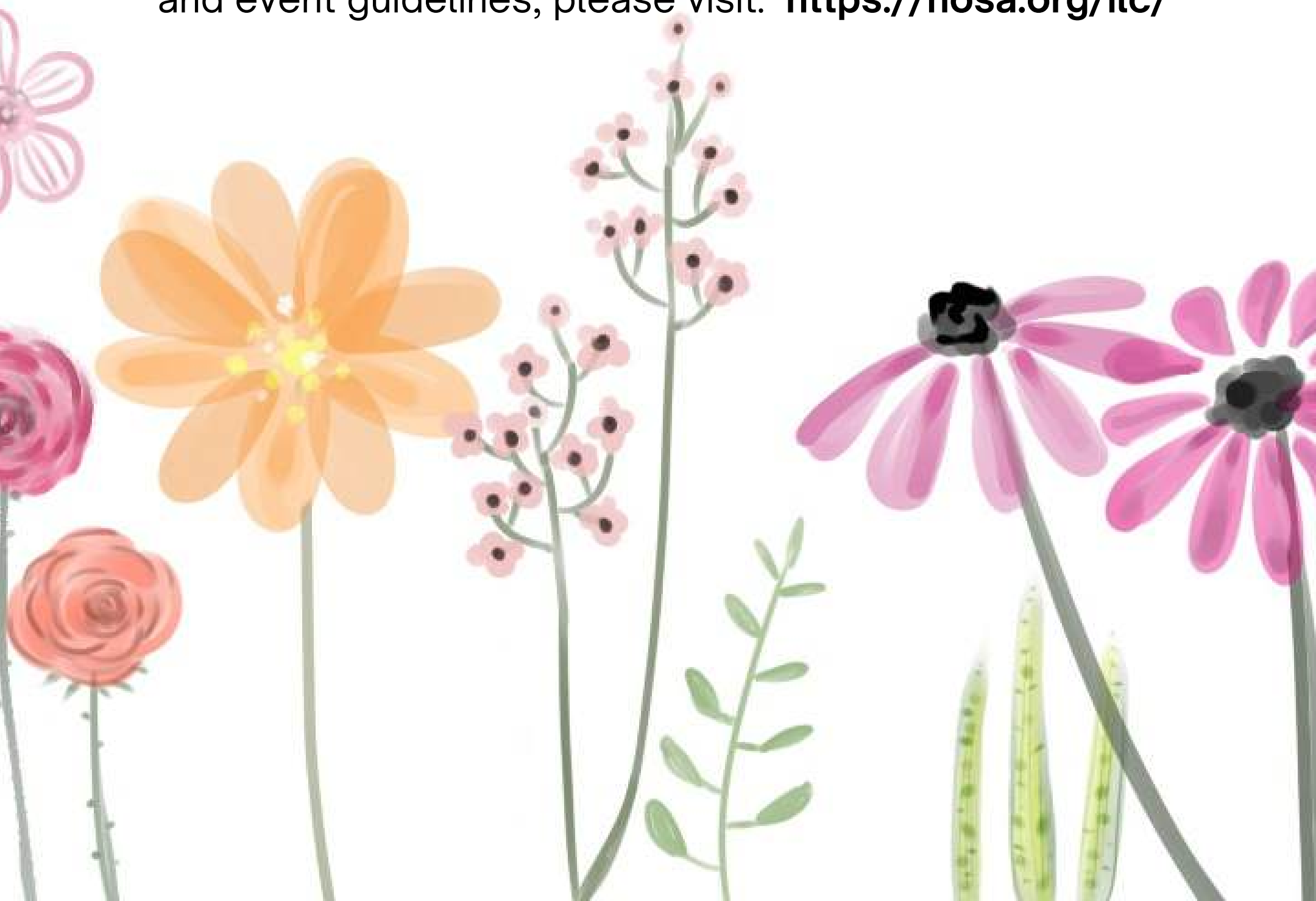

Competitive Events: CE

READ YOUR CE GUIDELINES!!

1. You can only register for ONE of the competitive events that you won. You cannot enter a new event.
2. If you are in a team event and some members cannot attend, you cannot replace with new members if it will be a new majority.
3. If your CE requires materials to be uploaded, you will have to do this again, once your advisor registers you for the ILC.
4. You can change your uploads for ILC. Upload deadline: May 15th

ILC Badges & Trading Pins

Once registration closes, Dr. Savitzky will reach out to your advisor to find out when you and your chaperone(s) will arrive in Houston, Texas.

Check-in is June 26 from 8-11 AM, this is when you will receive your badge and 10 NYS HOSA trading pins, after this time you will have to work out a way with her to get your required badge to enter all HOSA areas.

Opening Session is at 7PM, if you arrive after 6:30 PM you will have to make arrangement to receive your badges after Opening Session. Dr. Savitzky will not be able to meet with you during this time.
